




Dear Perth Habonim,

A success story - Perth Habonim Dror 1994 - and this publication is just one more project reflecting the thriving Movement I found on my recent visit. The current leadership can sit back with well-deserved satisfaction...but if they do, the task will be incomplete. By definition, Youth Movements are led by dynamic young people who change each year or so - it can be a positive but also a negative attribute. New leaders bring new ideas and give more people with fresh enthusiasm the opportunity to take positions of responsibility, but at the same time there can be a loss of continuity and longer term planning.

One measure of success is what the Movement will look like in the future - say three to five years time. NEW YOUTH MOVEMENT FOUNDED

A new Zionist identity for Jewish youth

A Jewish youth organisation was founded yesterday, in Bethnal Green, in the East End of London. Its aim is to provide a social, cultural and religious basis, to the lives of Jewish youth. Much of the time spent in its company will be devoted to learning the language of modern Hebrew, and, more generally, to bring young Jews together in an atmosphere, markedly different from the occasionally intimidating one of the synagogue foyer.

Its founder, Mr. Wellesley Aron, who has recently returned from a trip to Palestine, hopes for there to be a high Zionist content to the educational aspect of their activities. In the more immediate term, he intends to publish a guidebook on "good leadership", so as to reassure worried parents, and so as to give the leaders the confidence to run exciting, informative and, most importantly, fun activities.

The ideology of Habonim Dror is officially based on four platforms:

Judaism - Habonim Dror is pluralistic, encouraging respect for each individual's expression of Judaism. Jewish values influence all our ideology.

Zionism - Aliyah, immigration to Israel, is the aim of the Movement.

Socialism - Kibbutz Aliyah is the culmination of all Habonim's ideals, building a society based on communal responsibility and equality of opportunity.

Self-Realisation - calls on each member of the Movement to act on their own ideology.



News Around Australia

In 1994, Habonim Dror in Perth is entering its 50th year and as a Federal Movement we are entering our 55th year.

We operate in four cities throughout Australia - Adelaide, Melbourne, Perth and Sydney. This makes us the largest Zionist Youth Movement in the country.

MELBOURNE has the largest and most active Jewish community in Australia. Habonim Dror has a BIG cubbyhouse located near the Yarra River. In 1992 they started renovating their cubbyhouse and are currently looking for a temporary place to hang out. They all rely on their parents to write decent programs and party hard but at least its keeping the Movement alive. Well done Habo Melbourne!

PERTH has a somewhat smaller membership but true to the Habo tradition can still party as hard as their Melbourne counterparts. The only striking difference between the two is the fact that their siblings write the programs not their parents. Perth Habo's cubbyhouse is situated in the Jewish Centre alongside the school, sports centre and just about every other Jewish organisation. In fact if it weren't for Dianella and Noranda every Jew in Perth would probably live there. Well done Habo Melbourne!

ADELAIDE also known as "the city of uno synagogue" is one of the most beautiful cities in Australia. The only problem is that the only time anybody ever gets to see it is from a 747 on their way to the Eastern States. If you get a chance this summer it's the ideal location to take your family for a relaxing holiday, and look for Habo if you get a chance. Well done Habo Melbourne!

SYDNEY won the Olympics and this had a profound effect on the Habonim Movement there. As a result of the announcement, Sydney Habonim had one extra Chanich to their weekly meetings increasing membership by 100%. It is rumoured that Sydney's cubbyhouse will be a target for the Olympic Management Committee as a possible venue for the gymnastics. Well done Habo Melbourne!





H **THE SUCCESS** of the seminar provided for some much needed education on a very sensitive and precarious issue.





SHOMRIM 2 - YEAR 10



more and more cynical and measure the world through material wealth, the Habonim Movement is dealing with the environment, friendships and education. Is this attitude valid?


FACT





PATHWAY TO PEACE

COMPROMISE OR COMBAT?



THE UNLOCKING of the gateway to a Middle East peace on the 13th of September gave the ceremony on the White House lawn exceptional importance. Some old combatants, determined to fight on, may choose not to walk through. But until now they did not have the choice. The path is now open. Whatever lies ahead for the Palestinian and Israeli people will depend on whether or not they want it badly enough. Their common aim must be to ensure that, at any cost, the gate must be prevented from ever closing again.

THE AGREEMENT as a Peace Accord must be seen in the context of the current situation in the Middle-East. In some ways it was tailored to suit the passing political problems of the leadership of both sides. In this respect, it can either be viewed as an unacceptable "tranquilliser" in order for the Palestinian problem to go away or as a breakthrough for a people in pre-statehood phase. Israel now recognises the PLO as a legitimate representative of the Palestinian people. Arafat declared the PLO's recognition of Israel and renounced terror, promising to revoke anti-Israel elements of the PLO charter. It are these facets of the relationship between Israel and the PLO that will lead to a peace between the two actors and the eventual establishment of a Palestinian State within the pre-1967 borders.

THE LABOR coalition in Israel believes that with the agreement, the Intifadah will end at last and that there will be a truce between Jew and Arab. However, the Government has to acknowledge that peace can only be built on common interests and mutual beneficial action.

MOREOVER, it must be clear, that the establishment of an independent state is a *sine qua non* for peace between the peoples. Such a peace will include the Palestinian's right for sovereignty in Jerusalem, the eventual dismantling of settlements in the territories and the elimination of the destructive potential of settler provocation.

HOWEVER, there is no doubting that the road ahead will be rough. The objective of the agreement is not an armed truce, but peace. The Israelis, perhaps under a change of government could narrow their horizons so that the symbolic deal becomes a be-all and end-all in itself. This would confirm the Palestinians fear that they are being ensnared in a "Gaza and Jericho first...and last" trap. If today's Israeli's truly want peace for their children, they will have to treat the Palestinians as full partners on the way to it. That calls for trust, which neither side feels - or has reason to give. It calls for readiness - to accept that the Palestinian people want real independence, not an agreement forced upon them by sheer hunger to be rid of the Palestinian problem.

IN SHORT, the Israel-PLO Peace Accord faces many problems. None more than that of extremism on both sides of the fence. The trouble is that there is always

some who are not willing to find a compromise. Religious fervour from groups such as Hamas and Islamic Jihad continue to bring fear into the hearts of Israelis ready to compromise. On the Jewish side, religious settlers who will never be content without a Greater Israel, continue to disrupt the peace agenda. Men like Baruch Goldstein and settlement blocs like Gush Emunim and Gush Etzion are

more than willing to create a chaos in the midst of an evolutionary peace. The best to be hoped for is that practical men and women may agree to put their views aside and settle for the best that the real world can offer - a bit of give and take. The trouble is that these fundamentalists are always ready to cry for the whole loaf; Arabs and Muslims, many of them not Palestinians, still determined to see the very existence of Israel as an injury.

IN A SENSE, battlelines are joined. On one side is the Israeli Government, a handful of Arab Governments, the PLO, and the majority of the Palestinians living in the West Bank and Gaza. They all have an over-whelming interest in making the peace work. Raged against them are the cynical, the unhappy and the greedy, backed by militant fundamentalists, some Jewish and some Muslim, who do not want any deal, good or bad. It is quite unclear at this stage which group will emerge the strongest.





THIS year's camp saw *Madrichim* (leaders) coming from all over Australia including Sydney, Melbourne, Perth and a few from overseas - two from South Africa and one all the way from Israel. The turnout was incredible, with 60 *chanichim* (kids) ranging from Year Four to Year Eleven. It was an opportunity for *chanichim* to learn about current issues both directly related to the peace process in the Middle East as well as topical issues closer to home, including the environment and growing up in today's society.

THE *chanichim* were split up into age groups, and participated in programs developed by the *madrichim* to be both entertaining and a learning experience. There were several opportunities for all the *chanichim* to interact with others from different years, including meal times and *chugim* (activities such as candle making, bush survival, relaxation, Israeli dancing).

THERE was a fantastic hike which took over five hours, enabling us all to see the sun rise over the beautiful Darling Ranges, and many of the waterfalls in the area. There was also the final party which was a carnival for the *chanichim* and a skit night. On Friday, we were joined by about 20 parents for lunch, then each group entertained their parents with skits and all the *chanichim* were presented with a camp t-shirt and a certificate. The final ceremony was completed with the release of 30 helium balloons attached with messages of peace written by the *chanichim*. Overall it was an amazing camp.

MANY THANKS must go to RUTH FAIGEN for doing a marvellous job in the kitchen, producing the best food Habonim Camps have ever had. Appreciation should also be extended to DAVID LEIB for kashering the kitchen and acting as Shomer for the camp. Without David's support, and the financial support from the PHC and the Northern Suburbs Hebrew Congregation Ladies Guild, it would be impossible to maintain our Kashrut standards which allow any child to attend Habonim Camps, regardless of their religious stance. LEST WE FORGET OUR GENERATION REMEMBERS THE SHOAH



'27 April 1993

Cracow. A ghetto. A pharmacy. A wall. An old man who spoke English to us. We feel guilty for not understanding enough. A labour camp. Words, songs, a radio broadcast. It is so difficult to be in this comfort and write distinct words, fogged with pain, misinterpretation and a willingness to understand why. They sang the Hatikvah. Behind us stood a child no less than 15, with a solitary tear falling openly and without fear. She held proudly the blue and white flag, as a reminder, to tell them that we are still here. We did not cry, but neither did we speak. We laughed about the sunshine, sang about our youth, talked about Israel, but shouted silence when they spoke of the Holocaust."

THIS is so difficult to talk about. So dispiriting. Everything we thought about is receding from us. Everything that we read about concerning the Shoah makes us angry. Yet I know that all we can do is never to forget the atrocities. It seems, whether we want to or not, we are duty bound to remind ourselves about the Holocaust. By educating, by reading, by listening, by watching, by constantly reassuring each other that this can never happen again.

AS youth in Poland, we witnessed the horrors. The hair, the shoes, the bags, the eyeglasses, a little porcelain doll enclosed in a box. We'd peer into the glass encased rooms wondering. Wondering how so many people could die. Wondering how. Why?

THE Nazis did not discriminate between Jews. Religious, secular, sephardic, ashkenazi, Zionist, anti-Zionist. Men, women and children. All the differences disappeared in the smoke of the crematorium chimneys. There, we again became the "chosen people". Chosen to be murdered.

WE are all survivors of the Holocaust, whether we were there or not, even if we had not yet been born when it happened. The Holocaust left its mark on us, on our collective and individual being. It affects our daily life, our attitudes and it has an impact on our future.

IN a few years, those who witnessed the Nazi atrocities will pass away. The obligation to remember and to remind others is being transferred to us. We the youth must take responsibility for the collective memory of the Jewish people.

WE are left with the one thing we wanted not to say because it is so old, yet at the same time so inviting. We are responsible for all the Jews no matter where they are living. We are all responsible for each other because we share a common fate. Fate did not discriminate between Jews in the Shoah. If they united us in Auschwitz, we must unite in the construction of Israel. Just as we must always be aware of the Holocaust, so must we always be aware of the State of Israel.





A LOOK AT MODERN DAY KIBBUTZ

SITTING, reading biblical stories overlooking the sundrenched hills of the Galil one can almost picture the primitive Jew, Zadok, plodding along on his faithful donkey. It is this biblical landscape which has witnessed the dawning of the Jewish people. Civilisations later, it was the same hills that witnessed the re-birth of the State for the Jewish people and now they are witnessing something else. Some would say a new chapter in Jewish history, others would term it the end of one such chapter; the modern Kibbutz.

I BEGIN to contemplate my own thoughts along a march through this same landscape where I expect to find practical proof of my ideology at its conclusion, the march from Kibbutz Hakuk to Kibbutz Kadarim. My mind's eye slowly depicts these thoughts... I would be greeted at the gate by a traditional "Anglosaxon Sabra" haloed in a "Kova Temple", draped in dignified royal blue clothing of various faded tones, holding a stubby. Yet I soon stroll aside Kadarim's largest field where the "cartiff" occurs all year round at the final position of the assembly line and where the chalutzim must clock-out for their 19:07 minute hafsakah.

I FINALLY make the ascent to the Kibbutz centre where the Kibbutz housing captures my imagination. Circling the chadar-ochel it still shines and the flowers still smile yet they are shadowed by a "satellite dish". Do they have a radio station? Of course not! No anaf (work-branch) can reap its yield without cable television.

I SOON realise my walk was not an ideological ascent, yet a walk through Zionist, socialist history which has given me an insight into kibbutz looking at tomorrow, instead of dreaming about yesterday on the banks of the Kinneret.
